A SAD GREYHOUND OCCURANCE WITH A HAPPY ENDING.... ALFRED EVANS

The following story is a true event that happened in September 2008 with our greyhound Chloe.

Through a miscommunication between my spouse and myself, the garage doors were left open and Chloe decided to take a walk unattended. She was only two houses down on the street when my husband and son saw her on the street. They immediately stopped, as Chloe encounter a young teenager coming home from school. She had her hands raised and was circling around in an attempt to get away from Chloe crying, "I'm afraid of big dogs! I'm afraid of big dogs!" My husband gave the command to come and Chloe came while the young woman turned on her heel and walked away.

Two and a half hours later, we received a call from the local police stating that they were escorting the young woman and her mother to the hospital with a dog bite. I KNEW that Chloe was not capable of biting as she is a people dog. Time passed and in October, Chloe developed grand mal seizures. Also in October, we received a letter from "Call Lee Free" asking for our home owner's information which we submitted. Again, time passed with no feed back from Citizen's. I attempted to get copies of the police report and the any other documentation. I was given the police report but was not able to get the pictures for submission to Citizen's because of 2 reason's. 1) The local police department had one individual who determined the severity of the so called bite and 2) the young women was a minor and HIPPA applied.

Then in March, we were notified by Citizen's that our homeowner's policy would not be renewed as Citizen's was going to pay off the claim. For all of you with dogs, the State of Michigan law is such that insurance companies will pay off, out of court, rather than investigate, go to court and pay a possible higher settlement. Also, no other insurance company will pick you up under a new homeowner's policy unless the dog is destroyed or moved permanently out of the home. If one moves the dog to temporary living arrangements in an attempt to hide the dog, and then the dog returns, the homeowner will be sued for fraud. Since we could not find any other insurance carrier to cover our home, I contacted Margurite @ Michigan Greyhound Connection to ask that she start the process of finding another home for Chloe because we were NOT going to put her down

Though legal assistance offered by MGC, the pictures were obtained, reviewed by Citizen's and it was determined that there was no puncture wound, therefore no dog bite and the case was closed with no pay out on the claim. WE CAN NOT TELL ALL OF YOU HOW THANKFUL WE ARE FOR BEING ABLE TO KEEP OUR CHLOE!

Also, it was determined that Chloe's thyroid was on the lower side and with medication, she has been asymptomatic since March.

Leonard Schwartz of Sommers Schwartz was the very helpful attorney in this story. He was amazing and helped the Evans with this horrible event. A sad P.S. to this story is that Chloe died recently. Just so sad.

Expanding glues are a "growing" problem for dogs

Your sweet little Lab puppy suddenly begins vomiting and refuses to eat. You notice that her belly is bulging and tender to the touch. Worried, you immediately rush her to the vet. Once there, the vet does x-rays and notices a large mass in her stomach. She is rushed into surgery to remove the mass. Later you are told that the mass was a softball-sized lump of expanded and solidified polyurethane glue.

Polyurethane glues, also known by brand names such as Gorilla Glue®, Probond®, Titebond®, Ultimate Polurethane Glue®, Excel glue product®, as well as

many other glue products, are water-activated expanding adhesives commonly used for home improvement, woodworking, and repair projects. *And unfortunately, Gorilla Glue apparently tastes like maple syrup and peanuts.* In other words, **just like antifreeze, it is highly attractive to dogs** — **and just like antifreeze, it can kill.** Most manufacturer warnings state the product must be kept out of reach of children and animals and that it's harmful or fatal if swallowed.

Once the glue comes in contact with moisture, like that found in your dog's stomach, it expands to several times its original volume. The expanding mass can cause intestinal blockage and eventually death. According to the <u>ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center</u> (APCC), pet poisonings from wood glues — and other adhesives containing the substance diphenylmethane diisocyanate (MDI) — are growing. And MDI isn't always listed on the label. Since 2005, the APCC has treated more than 135 cases of pets who've ingested expanding glues. Of those incidents, 98% involved dogs and 78% were evaluated at high or medium risk for developing severe, life-threatening problems.

Signs may vary depending on the amount and type of polyurethane glue your dog is exposure to. The most common exposure is ingestion and signs may include: drooling, shaking the head, pawing at the mouth, coughing, gagging, retching, vomiting, lack of appetite, abdominal enlargement, and abdominal pain or discomfort. Any expanding adhesive product should be considered a potential hazard and kept where pets can't get to it, according to the APCC.

There is no home care for ingested polyurethane products; call your veterinarian immediately if your pet is acting symptomatic or if you believe he or she has ingested any type of glue. Do not induce vomiting and do not feed your pet. Although removal of the hardened glue typically requires surgery, the recovery prognosis is good. So keep a sharp eye on your pet and never leave any type of glue where pets (or kids) can reach it.
